

Reality of Removing Lead from Aviation Fuel.

Through the FAA's EAGLE Initiative, several organizations are working towards an unleaded fuel replacement through Supplemental Type Certificate (STC) process and the Internationals ASTM specifications. Original companies taking part of the program were Shell, General Aviation Modifications Inc. (GAMI), Swift Fuels Inc., Phillips 66/Afton Chemical, LyondellBasell/VP Racing were working alongside the FAA to develop a drop-in unleaded AvGas replacement for the current 100 Low Lead fuel. Both Shell and Phillips 66/Afton Chemical have withdrawn from the program.

In 2002, GAMI received an Engine and Airframe STC amendment from the FAA, permitting the use of unleaded fuel for the models listed on the FAA approved model list. Swift Fuels has been selling UL94 nationwide since 2015 and is the FAA certification programs for STC and in the ASTM International specification program. Attendees will gain insight into the ongoing research aimed at developing a drop-in unleaded replacement fuel to meet the needs of high-performance piston-driven aircraft currently utilizing 100LL AvGas.




